Sailing Instructions

1. RULES

1.1 The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), and the prescriptions of US SAILING, the Procedural Rules for Intercollegiate Sailing Competition (PR) (except as any of these are modified by these sailing instructions), and by these Sailing Instructions.

1.2 APPENDIX T-1 PENALTIES AT THE TIME OF THE INCIDENT

The first two sentences of rule 44.1 are changed to: 'A boat may take a One-Turn Penalty when she may have broken a rule of Part 2 or rule 31 while racing. However, when she may have broken a rule of Part 2 while in the zone around a mark other than a starting mark, her penalty shall be a Two-Turns Penalty.'

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

2.1 Notices to competitors, including boat rotations, will be posted on the official regatta notice board located on Techscore.

3. CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Any changes in the sailing instructions will be announced orally by the Race Committee and posted before the first race in which they are to take effect.

4. BOATS AND EQUIPMENT

4.1 Whitecap Turbo FJs will be provided. Shrouds may not be adjusted. Forestays are adjustable and should always be set looser than the jib luff.

4.2 Competitors shall report any damage or loss of equipment, however slight, to the Race Committee on the water. Violations may lead to disqualification according to PR 26.

4.3 Breakdown points will not be awarded for the failure of knots, the loss of pins or rings, except that the Jury may, but is not required to, grant redress for the failure of the main halyard masthead knot.

5. FORMAT & ROTATION

5.1 Format- The regatta format will be a single round robin.

5.2 Rotation – Rotation will be done from power boats on the water.

5.2 The RC reserves the right to end racing at any time for safety concerns.

6. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

Saturday

0930 Report Time

0945 Competitors' Meeting (all A Division sailors fully dressed). All A Division competitors must be prepared to leave by tow to the race area immediately after the Competitors' Meeting. B Division competitors and coaches will travel by car to Camp Fuller after the Competitors' Meeting and transported to Gardiner's Island from the camp.

1020 First Warning

There will be no lunch break.

1800 No Start Signal after this time

Sunday

0930 Report Time

0945 Tows to the race areas will depart.

1015 First Warning

1500 No Start Signal after this time

7. RACING AREA

7.1 The racing area will be Salt Pond south of Gardiner's Island.

8. THE COURSE

8.1 The courses will be announced orally and are shown on the attached drawing, Appendix A - Courses.

8.2 All marks will be bright orange "tomatoes".

9. START/FINISH

9.1 Races will be started in accordance with 13(b)(iv).

9.2 The starting line will be between a staff on the Race Committee Signal Boat and the water's edge (course side) of the starting mark. The starting pin will be the farther away Orange mark at the port end. The Orange mark in the middle area of the line is **not** a mark at the start.

9.3 Preparatory flags will be used to supplement the sound starting system. Either a P Flag or an I flag shall be displayed at 2 minutes and removed at 1 minute before each start signal.

9.4 The finish line will be between a staff on the Race Committee Boat and a nearby mark for downwind finishes. The finish line will be between the windward mark and offset mark for upwind finishes.

9.5 If a boat is delaying the finish of a race, or the rotation, the Race Committee may end the race and score the boat in its current position.

10. RECALLS

10.1 Individual recalls will be signaled in accordance with PR 13(b)(iv).

The Race Committee will attempt to hail the boat(s) sail number(s); however, it is the responsibility of each boat to make a proper start. Failure to hear a hail is insufficient cause for granting redress.

10.2 Multiple whistles and the hail of the words "general recall" will signal a general recall. No visual signal will be given. PR 13(b)(v) shall also be in effect.

11. CHANGES OF COURSE AFTER THE START

Any mark of the course may be moved in accordance with PR 13(b)(ii).

12. PROTESTS

12.1 Protests shall be filed within 20 minutes of reaching the shore after the race in which the incident occurred. Changes PR 25.

13. COACHING

Coach boats will not be provided. All coaching will be done from Gardiner's Island.

14. SAFETY

14.1 A boat requesting assistance from support boats should signal by waving hands overhead.

14.2 A capsized boat may be righted and sailed by its crew, unless, in the sole judgment of the Race Committee, safety or the progress of the regatta would be affected, in which case the crew shall accept assistance, and the boat will be scored 'DNF.'

14.3 Starts may not be delayed to accommodate capsized boats.
