1 RULES

1.1 Regattas will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing, The ICSA Procedural Rules, the Rules of the Collegiate Dinghy Class, and the NEISA Rules and Regulations Manual.

2 COVID-19 Protocol

- 2.1 Sailors and coaches will be the only people allowed in the pavilion or on the docks. All spectators must watch from the sidewalk.
- 2.2 All sailors and coaches must wear masks or buffs when they are in the building and in restrooms.
- 2.3 Visiting sailors and coaches will only enter the pavilion to store sails and equipment.
- 2.4 In the event of a thunderstorm all sailors and coaches are welcome to seek shelter in the boat bay.

3 NOTICES TO COMPETITIORS

3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on TechScore, and they may also be posted on a whiteboard outside the building near the docks.

4 CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

4.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted 15 minutes before it will take effect.

6 BOATS

6.1 The regatta will be sailed in Boston University Zim FJs. Standing rigging settings shall not be adjusted.

7 RACING AREA

7.1 All races will take place on the Charles River between the Mass Ave and Boston University Bridges.

8 COURSES

8.1 Courses will be announced by the Race Committee prior to the start of each race. They are likely to be W3, W4, and W5 with an offset mark and a gate separate from the start and finish lines. Diagrams of the courses and any modifications may be posted on the official notice board.

9 MARKS

9.1 All turning marks will be red. All starting marks will be white.

10 THE START

10.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying a flag on the starting boat at the starboard end and the course side edge of the port end starting mark.

11 THE FINISH

- 11.1 On course W4 the finish will be between a staff displaying a flag on the starting boat and the starting mark.
- 11.2 On Courses W3 and W5 the finish line will be between the windward mark and the offset mark.

12 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 12.1 Protest forms are available online. Protests shall be delivered to the Race Committee within the posted protest time limit.
- 12.2 In the event no time limit is posted ICSA procedural rule 30 will apply.

13. COACHING

13.1 All coaching will take place from the Boston University competition docks.
