SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

The regatta will be governed by: the ICSA Procedural Rules 2021-2024 including the Collegiate Dinghy Class Rules; the 2021-2024 Racing Rules of Sailing; the Prescriptions of US SAILING; the PCCSC Standing Rules, the Notice of Race and these Sailing Instructions. In the event of a disagreement between the NOR and these SI's, the SI's will take precedence.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices, scores, and changes will be announced verbally at the rotation area or competitors meetings.

3. CHANGES IN THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted before 1030 on the day they will take effect, except any changes to the schedule of races will be posted by 1800 on the day before they will take effect.

3. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed from a flagpole near the launch ramp and rotation area.

5. RACING AREAS

The sailing area will be in Marina Bay Yacht Harbor. Further description will be given at the competitors meeting.

6. COURSES

Courses will be chosen from the attached course chart, and will be hailed before the beginning of each start sequence.

7. MARKS

Varsity and JV share the same course.

8. START/FINISH

Start and finish lines will be between a buoy and an orange flag on the RC boat. Boats that cross this line when not starting or finishing shall be scored DNF without a hearing. The starting sequence shall be as described in Appendix S, with the warning given 3 minutes before the start.

9. OCS

The RC may attempt to hail the sail number of a boat OCS, but failure to receive or hear this hail shall not be grounds for redress. It is each boat's responsibility to start correctly.

10. CHANGE OF COURSE

The RC may move any mark of the course without signal before a boat has rounded the previous mark.

11. TIME LIMITS

There will be no time limit. However, the RC may choose to finish boats 'on the course' if their position in the race has been established in order to expedite the next start or rotation.

12. PROTESTS/REDRESS

Varsity protests and requests for redress must be filed within 10 minutes of the race committee's return to the dock. Forms will be available at the Cal Team Table. JV protest shall be heard using the 3 minute justice system. Results of JV protests must be reported to the host school immediately. All boats must notify the RC of their intent to protest immediately following the finish of the race in which the incident occurred.

13. SCORING

Scoring shall be completed as described in the Procedural Rules.

14. RECORD OF PARTICIPATION

RP forms must be completed online at ts.collegesailing.org before 0800 on Monday October 20th, 2025.

15. SUPPORT BOATS

The host school will provide all on-water support. All coaching shall be done from the rotation area, or a similar onshore location.

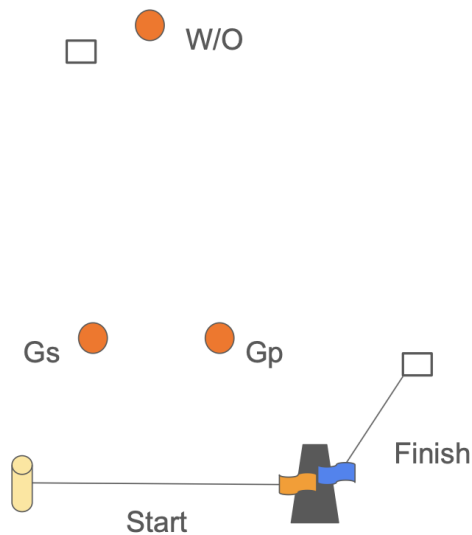
15. PERSONAL FLOATION DEVICES

Each competitor shall wear a USCG - approved inherently buoyant Type III, Type V, Level 50 or Level 70 PFD at all times while on the water except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment.

16. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Participants in this event compete entirely at their own risk. See Rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

Notes:

-W/O: Orange weather mark followed by a white offset mark, both round to port.

-"Gs" and "Gp" are orange marks and represent the gate. Round from the inside, "Gs" is rounded to starboard and "Gp" to port.
