SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

RULES

1.1 This regatta will be governed by the current Racing Rules of Sailing, the Procedural Rules (PR) and Class Rules for Intercollegiate Sailing Competition, and the NEISA Rules and Regulations, except as any of these are modified by these Sailing Instructions.

1.2 RRS Appendix P will be in effect, as modified by PR 32.

1.3 Any questions regarding these Sailing Instructions should be submitted in writing to John_Mollicone@brown.edu and will be passed on to the jury.

NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

2.1 Notices will be posted on the official regatta notice board located on TechScore.

CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Any changes in the sailing instructions will be announced orally and posted before the first race in which they are to take effect.

FORMAT

5.1 The event will be sailed in two divisions with one fleet of 420s for both divisions or both FJs (A-div) and 420s (B-div) if conditions allow.

5.2 A single round robin of 10 races is scheduled. Competitors will switch boats after every two races.

5.3 The format for boats and sails may be changed by the PRO in consultation with the NEISA Representative if conditions warrant a change.

BOATS & EQUIPMENT

6.1 2022 Zim 420e's will be provided for all competitors, who shall not modify any boat or cause them to be modified in any way. 2025 Zim FJs are on option if conditions allow.

6.2 Competitors have the option of rigging the mainsheet purchase either 3:1 or 4:1.

6.3 The standing rigging shall not be adjusted.

6.4 The penalty for infringing instruction 6.1, 6.2, or 6.3 will be disqualification from all races sailed in contravention of those instructions.

6.5 Competitors shall report all damage or loss of equipment, however slight, to *the* PRO/dock staff or to the Race Committee Finish Boat on the water.

ROTATION

7.1 The rotation of boats will be in accordance with the online rotation, which is available on Tech Score.

MARKS

8.1 All rounding marks will be orange/red balls.

8.2 The starting mark will be a white ball. The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Race Committee start boat and the starting mark.

8.3 For downwind finishes on course W4, the finishing mark will be a white ball (same as start mark). The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Race Committee boat and the finishing mark (same as starting line).

8.4 For upwind finishes on courses W3 and W5, the finishing line will be between the windward mark and the offset mark (marks 1 and 2).

COURSE

9.1 Courses will be Windward/Leewards with 3, 4, or 5 legs.

STARTING SYSTEM

10.1 Races will be started in accordance with PR 18(b)(i).

RECALLS

11.1 Individual recalls will be signaled in accordance with Procedural Rule 18(b)(ii).

11.2 A general recall will be used in accordance to PR 18(b)(iii). No visual signal will be given. After a general recall, the Round-an-End Rule, RRS 30.1, shall apply and no signal need be given. (Changes RRS 30.1)

PROTESTS

12.1 Protests shall be filed in accordance with the ICSA Procedural Rules.

12.2 Protests shall be filed within 30 minutes of securing boats to the shore after the race or set of races in which the incident occurred or after a division switch if one fleet of boats is used. This changes PR 30.

12.3 Protests forms will be available near the white board on the first floor or from a Brown Representative.

SAFETY

13.1 Competitors who require assistance from rescue boats should so signify by waving arms overhead.

13.2 A competitor who retires from a race shall notify the Race Committee as soon as possible.

13.3 Starts will not be delayed to accommodate capsized boats.

COACHING

14.1 PR 19 will apply. All coaching will be from the docks of the Edgewood Yacht Club and ashore.
