

### 1 RULES

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RSS) for 2017-2020, the current ICSA Procedural Rules (PR's), this Notice of Race (NoR), and the Sailing Instructions (SI's).

### 2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted as described at the Competitor's Meeting.
- **2.2** Changes will be posted on the docks at the Rylander Pavilion.

### 4 [NP] ASSIGNMENTS OF BOATS

Boats will be identified by their sail number.

#### 5 REGATTA FORMAT

- **5.1** If nine or fewer teams are present, racing will be combined divisions with 2 races per set.
- **5.2** Rotations can be found online on Techscore.

#### 6 THE COURSES

Courses will be windward-leeward. Race Committee will signal number of legs before each start.

#### 7 MARKS

All marks with be either white or orange balls.

#### 8 THE START

- **8.1** Races will be started in accordance with ICSA PR 18(b)(i).
- **8.2** The starting line will be between the Race Committee boat and a white or orange ball indicating the port end of the line.

#### 9 RECALLS

- **9.1** Individual recalls will be signaled in accordance with ICSA PR 18(b)(ii). Race Committee will attempt to hail the boat's sail number; however, it is each boat's responsibility to make a proper start.
- **9.2** General recalls will be signaled in accordance with ICSA PR 18(b)(iii).

#### 10 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

To change the next leg of the course, the Race Committee will move the original mark (or finishing line) to a new position provided no boat is on the leg that it terminates. No signal shall be made for such change.

#### 11 THE FINISH

The finish line will be between the port side of the Race Committee boat and a white or orange ball indicating the port end of the line.

# 12 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- **12.1** Protests must be signaled on the water immediately by hailing "Protest" and the sail number of the boat being protested.
- **12.2** Any protest must be registered with Race Committee upon finishing the race.
- **12.3** Protest forms will be available with Shore Support, and must be submitted within 30 minutes of all boats reaching shore.

# 13 COACHING

ICSA PR 19 shall apply and coaches shall remain ashore.

### 14 SAFETY

- **14.1** USCG Approved Type III PFDs shall be worn and zipped at all times while on the water.
- **14.2** A boat that retires from a race shall notify the Race Committee as soon as possible.

### **15 RECORD OF PARTICIPATION (RP) FORMS**

RP Forms shall be completed before the conclusion of the regatta.

### 16 AUSTIN YACHT CLUB PRESCRIPTIONS

- **16.1** No pets, fireworks, drones, or open fires are allowed on AYC property.
- **16.2** AYC is committed to preventing the spread of the invasive species, zebra mussels, and asks that all boat owners (sailboats, motorboats, kayaks, etc.) clean their bilges and trailers when coming from another lake to Lake Travis, and again when leaving Lake Travis going to another lake.
