ORGANIZING AUTHORITY: Intercollegiate Sailing Association in conjunction with the University of South Florida.

1. RULES

- 1.1 This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, including Appendix S.
- 1.2 The ICSA Procedural Rules, and class rules, and any changes modified by these Sailing Instructions.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices will be posted on the official notice board located upstairs in the Haney Landing Waterfront.

3. CHANGE TO SAILING INSTRUCTION

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0845 on the day it will take effect.

4. BOATS

- 4.1 This regatta will utilize twenty USF provided CFJs.
- 4.2 Standing rigging shall not be adjusted.
- 4.3 Equipment problems should be reported to a race committee representative as soon as possible. Breakdowns will be handled per ICSA procedural rules.

5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed on the white board upstairs at the USFSP Haney Landing Waterfront.

6. SCHEDULE OF RACES / FORMAT

- 6.1 Saturday, February 15, 2020
 - 0900 Report time / rigging
 - 0910 Competitor's Meeting. Start of first race as soon as possible thereafter

Sunday, February 16, 2020

- 0900 Report time / rigging. Start of first race as soon as possible thereafter
- 1500 No race started after this time

- 6.2 Conditions permitting, it is the goal of the Organizing Authority to complete twenty races.
- 6.3 A set will consist of 3 races prior to rotating. A division will remain in boats 1-10, B division in boats 11-20.

7. RACING AREA

The racing will be either in Tampa Bay or the adjacent Bayboro Harbor.

8. COURSE AND MARKS

Courses shall be windward-leeward, with a windward offset and a leeward gate. Downwind courses will be designated W2 or W4, upwind finishes will be W3 or W5, with the finish between a finish boat with a blue flag and the nearest mark. All marks are orange balls. Optionally the course may be a modified WL, with the start / finish line in the middle.

9. PROTESTS / REDRESS REQUEST

- 9.1 Protest forms are available on the Official Notice board, and shall be submitted there.
- 9.3 The protest time limit is 20 minutes after the RC finish boat docks. This time will be posted.

10. SCORING

- 10.1 A and B divisions will race together, combined scoring.
- 10.2 Three races must be completed to constitute a regatta.
