SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

- 1.1. This regatta will be governed by the current Racing Rules of Sailing (2021-2024), the Procedural Rules and Class Rules for Intercollegiate Sailing Competition, and the NEISA Rules and Regulations, except as any of these are modified by these Sailing Instructions.
- 1.2. All Races will be umpired. RRS D2 will apply as modified by the Procedural Rules.
- 1.3. RRS D4.3(b) is deleted.
- 1.4 Results from each round robin will carry forward.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

2.1. Notices will be posted to the notice board on Techscore.

3. CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1. Any changes in the sailing instructions will be announced orally and posted before the first race in which they are to take effect.

4. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

5. FORMAT

- 5.1. The format for the regatta is as follows:
- 5.1.1. Round 1 Round Robin of all 10 Teams
- 5.1.2. Round 2 Round Robin of the Top 8 Teams or Top 6 Teams
- 5.1.3. Round 3 Round Robin of the Top 6 Teams or Top 4 Teams
- 5.2. Any changes to this format will be in accordance with PR 25(f), except as changed by these SI.
- 5.2.1. PR 25(f) is changed to: When conditions make the announced format unmanageable, the NEISA Rep, Regatta Chairman, and Chief Umpire may alter the format to ensure an equitable determination of the winner.
- 5.3. In the event SI 5.1.2 cannot be completed, races completed between teams sailing in SI 5.1.2 shall count as races sailed in a subsequent new round.

6. BOATS AND EQUIPMENT

- 6.1. 2014 LP Z420s and 2017 Zim FJs will be provided for all competitors, who shall not modify any boat or cause them to be modified in any way.
- 6.2. The standing rigging shall not be adjusted.
- 6.3. The penalty for infringing instruction 6.1 or 6.2 will be disqualification from all races sailed in contravention of

those instructions.

6.4. Competitors shall report all damage or loss of equipment, however slight, to the Race Committee Boat on the water.

7. ROTATION

7.1. Boat Rotation will be on techscore.

8. MARKS

- 8.1. Rounding marks will be orange/pink buoys.
- 8.2. The start line will be between a staff displaying a flag on the Race Committee Start Boat and a white buoy at the port end (start mark).
- 8.3. The finish line will be between a staff displaying a flag on the finish boat and an orange buoy at the port end.

9. COURSE

9.1. The course will be a Digital N.

10. STARTING SYSTEM

- 10.1. Races will be started in accordance with PR 18(b)(i).
- 10.2. The Race Committee may opt to use a rolling starting system; that is a system where the warning signal for a subsequent race is the starting signal for the previous race.

11. PROTESTS

11.1. Protests shall be initiated in accordance with RRS D2 as modified by Procedural Rule 25.

12. BREAKDOWNS

12.1. When a boat suffers a breakdown in the racing area, she may request a score change by hailing an umpire or the race committee to that effect at the first reasonable opportunity after the breakdown, until the hail is acknowledged. If possible, she shall continue racing. This changes RRS D5.2 and PR 25.

13. SCORING

- 13.1. RRS D3 and D4 shall be used, as modified by PR 25 and these Sailing Instructions.
- 13.2. Breakdowns will be scored in accordance with RRS D.5 as changed by PR 20.

14. SAFETY

- 14.1. Competitors who require assistance from rescue boats should so signify by waving arms overhead. A competitor who retires from a race shall notify the Race Committee as soon as possible.
- 14.2. Starts will not be delayed to accommodate capsized boats.

15. COACHING

15.1. Coaches will be on land.

15.2. Visiting Teams may fly a drone.
