Question 1:

For the purposes of implementing PR 25, when three or more teams have all raced each other in a single round robin, how many times have the tied teams met?

Answer:

Once

Question 2:

When "total points scored when the tied teams met" is used according to PR 25(c), which team wins the tie break?

Answer:

The team with the lowest point total when the tied teams met.

Question 3:

When a sailoff is used to break a tie but the result of the sail off is one or more ties, are points from the sailoff used in calculating "total points when the tied teams met"?

Answer:

Yes

Question 4:

For the purposes of SI 1.7, is a sailoff a "Round Robin"?

Answer:

No.

Question 5:

If a sailoff is used to break a tie based on the fact that the tie involves a qualifying place for a future round and the 'future round' is not sailed/completed, does the original tie need to be rebroken?

Answer:

No. The teams are no longer tied after the application of the proper tie breaking methods, due to the fact that a future round was scheduled and the tie involved qualification for that

round. Regardless of whether or not the 'future round' occurs, the tie no longer exists from that point forward.
