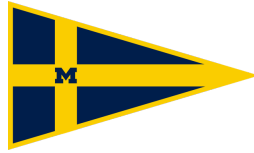

NOTICE OF RACE

1. RULES

- 1.1. The Organizing Authority (OA) is the Intercollegiate Sailing Association (ICSA) in conjunction with the Midwest Collegiate Sailing Association (MCSA) and the University of Michigan.
- 1.2. This regatta shall be governed by the current Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), including Appendix D Team racing Rules, ICSA Procedural Rules, ICSA Collegiate Dinghy Class Rules, and this Notice of Race (NOR), except as modified by the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.3. Procedural Rule 32 (Immediate Penalties For Breaking RRS 42) will be in effect.
- 1.4. In accordance with RRS D4.3(c), results from previous round-robin stages shall carry forward.

2. PHOTOGRAPHY, CAMERAS AND ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT

- 2.1. Boats may be required to carry cameras, sound equipment, or positioning equipment as specified by the Organizing Authority (OA).
- 2.2. Individuals and their teams are permitted to use personal video/film/camera or sound recording equipment on their boats, however, the video and audio obtained by their personal cameras may not be used during a protest hearing. Video/film/camera equipment includes, but is not limited to, GoPro and other action cameras, U.A.V.s, and Drones.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1. All regatta entrants must meet ICSA eligibility requirements and have been allocated a regatta berth to this event by the MCSA Regatta Coordinator. Berth allocations can be viewed by [clicking this link](#).
- 3.2. Regatta fees of \$10 per sailor will be charged.
- 3.3. Teams shall register in person by/on March 29th at the University of Michigan Sailing Club.
- 3.4. The 2-week drop deadline for this event is March 14th at 5 pm EST. The 24-hour drop deadline is March 28th at 12:00 pm EST. To drop your berth from this event, contact the MCSA Regatta Coordinator. Drop deadline penalties can be found on the MCSA website.
- 3.5. Team Uniforms - All student-athletes competing in ICSA regattas shall wear a uniform designating their college. The uniform shall be a lightweight jersey, bib, or pinnie worn over the lifejacket, or like-colored lifejackets. To designate the college, any combination of the college's name, nickname, mascot, or other identifying image shall be present on the back of the uniform and, except for an individual's name or number, shall be the same for all team members competing. ICSA recommends that the image used to designate the college be at least 8" X 8" in size.
- 3.6. All student-athletes shall register annually with ICSA prior to competing.
- 3.7. A college team representative shall enter completely on the Record of Participation Form the names and class years of all skippers and crews who competed, as well as the races in which they competed. A team failing to properly complete the Record of Participation Form before the expiration of protest time at the end of the regatta, shall be rescored according to PR 33(a) for fleet racing and PR 33(b) for team or match racing. 4. SCHEDULE AND NUMBER OF RACES

- 4.1 Multiple round-robins are planned. Round-robins failing to accomplish 80% of their races will not be included in final scores.

5. UMPIRED RACES

All races will be umpired, and Rule D2 will apply.

6. BOATS AND EQUIPMENT

6.1. Collegiate Dinghy FJs will be provided for competitors, who shall not modify any boat or cause them to be modified in any way. Competitors have the option of rigging the mainsheet purchase either 3:1 or 4:1.

6.2. The standing rigging shall not be adjusted.

7. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available before the competitors' meeting, online at the event website (scores.collegesailing.org), on the official notice board, and on the [MCSA Schedule](#).

8. RACING AREA

Races will be run from the Michigan Sailing Club, 8010 Strawberry Lake Rd, Dexter, MI 48130. The racing area will be on Baseline Lake.

9. SPECTATORS

9.1. All spectators shall remain at least 100 yards from the competitors while racing. Spectators shall receive 1 warning upon entering the "field of play".

9.2. Spectator boats shall not dock in areas that interfere with the function of the sailboat rotation area.

10. TROPHIES

10.1. Trophies will be awarded to teams in the following places: 1st through 3rd.

11. RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

11.1. By participating in this event, competitors automatically grant the Organizing Authority and the event sponsors the right, in perpetuity, to make, use and show, at their discretion, any photography, audio and video recordings, and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue, until their final departure, without compensation.
