1. Rules:

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing for 2021-2024, the prescriptions of US SAILING, the ICSA Procedural Rules, the PCCSC Standing Rules, this Notice of Race, and the Sailing Instructions.

2. Notices To Competitors:

3. Entry & Eligibility:

- 3.1. There is no limit places on number of entries
- 3.2. There is a \$50 Entry fee per boat to help cover the cost of the event. Please pay by using our website.

- 3.3. All PCCSC Regular or Provisional Member Schools in good standing are eligible to sail.
- 3.4. Sailors must meet all ICSA eligibility requirements and may be required to verify enrollment at the school they are representing.

4. Boats:

- 4.1. Teams will race PCCSC-legal CFJs to be provided by each team. Teams must provide their own PCCSC legal CFJ sails.
- 4.2. Limited charter boats may be available, Please contact asusailingclub@gmail.com for information. If you are chartering you must bring your own race sails, **rudders, and tillers.** (Our tillers have a tendency to break so please bring your own. If this is an issue please let us know.)
- 4.3. If there is a shortage of charters, schools traveling the largest distances will be given priority. If you are able to bring an extra boat or rudders and tillers to the event, please let us know at asusailingclub@gmail.com, and we may be able to arrange someone to charter a boat from you.
- 4.4. Charters cost \$75 for the weekend

- 10.1. The scoring system will follow the ICSA procedural rules.

11. Protests:

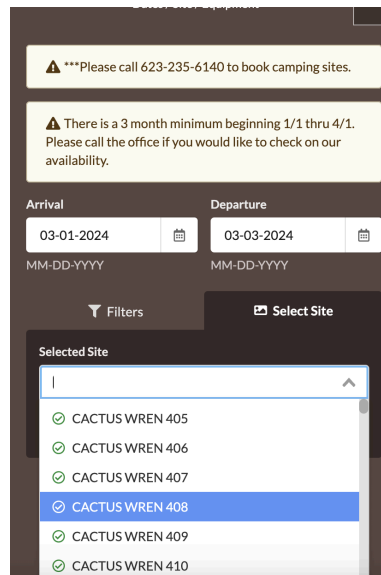
- 11.1. Protests shall be filed in accordance with the ICSA Procedural Rules with the following change. "Race Committee" in PR 29(b) is changed to "Race Committee Finish Boat."
- 11.2. Written protests, including requests for redress and breakdowns, shall be filed with RC within 30 minutes of the last competitor's arrival ashore after racing has completed for the day.
- 11.3. Protest forms will be available at the main meeting location (see SI's)
- 11.4. Video, data and/or photographs taken from any source shall not be used as evidence at protest hearings. This changes RRS 63.6

12. Housing:

- 12.1. Teams are encouraged to camp with us at a Pleasant Harbor Marina. Camping is paid for by tent, so please bring your biggest tents to help save cost. Camping may be reimbursed, depending on our budget
- 12.2. IT GETS COLD AT NIGHT, Temperatures in the mid 40's are expected at night. Be sure to bring towels, toiletries, and other things needed.
- 12.3. **We recommend calling Pleasant Harbor (623-235-6140)** to set up your reservation. Say you are with Cactus Cup and are looking to book a campsite in the "Cactus Wren" section of the campground.
- 12.4. Bathroom passes are available for \$10. This will get you showers, plumed sinks and toilets, and pool access. We recommend 1 pass for every 4 people. Make sure to mention on the phone the number of passes you want when booking.

12.5.4. Any number is fine, Just make sure it's "Cactus Wren"

12.5.5. You will not be able to buy a bathroom pass online and will have to wait until business hours the next day, (This is why we recommend calling)

12.5.6. Also make sure to add you vehicle details on the checkout screen (on the right hand side, just below the map)

12.6. There is a \$9 fee per car to enter the park each day. This can be avoided by camping

12.7. Due to the remoteness of the venue, food will be provided in the form of

12.7.1. Dinner on Friday and Saturday night

12.7.2. Breakfast on Saturday and Sunday morning

12.8. Teams should bring their own food for any dietary restrictive needs, lunches, snacks, and any additional meals they need.

12.9. Limited water will be available, teams should also bring their own water supply.
